When I came to Delhi, I had many dreams and a strong desire to do something, but I was unsure about what to do and what the future held. Some family circumstances and adjusting to a new city made it difficult for me. My father was also exploring new business opportunities, so I couldn't seek help from him either. I thought about doing something and help myself. After much thought, I decided to pursue ITI. I chose a college near me, HJ Bhabha ITI, and started my journey towards Cosmetology. My goal became clear.

I got the support of InShakti, where I truly found strength. I completed my education and found a goal of establishing a business at the grassroots level. Now, I needed funds to open a parlour, which was a huge challenge for me.

I applied for a loan from two different government institutions, but unfortunately, they asked for documents that were impossible for me to arrange. The challenge is tough, but my spirits were not dampened. I continued my efforts. I decided that I will only take a breath after achieving success.



I set up a parlor from my home under the name Beauty 4 You. I also registered my parlor online and through word of mouth, I gained some customers. Initially, the number of customers was not very high, but those who became my customers trusted me and that was the way forward for me. I started earning around Rs. 400-500. With good service and good work, the number of customers increased to 10-15, and then it increased to 20-25. My income also increased to Rs. 7000. My customers are very happy with my good work. I am getting good feedback, and InShakti is in constant touch with me. They taught me how to market my work in malls and other places through stall mediums, which gave me a good experience and also financial help.

Today, I am also providing my services in another parlour and continuing my efforts to grow my business. For the future, I am planning a 3-chair parlor and a vanity car, which will be a mobile parlour, providing convenience to customers. They can call me anywhere for their program and avail of the service.

I also receive guidance from InShakti from time to time. I have achieved my goals and will continue to improve. Because everyone's love and blessings are always with me, InShakti is the ray of hope for me, and I also have the self-confidence to move forward."

I developed an interest in beauty at a young age and started going to a local parlour. It was there that I learned about ITI and decided to enroll. I learned a lot at ITI, including how to do facials and set hair, and how to present my work efficiently in front of someone.

Meeting Bhawna ma'am from InShakti was a turning point for me. Her words filled me with so much motivation that I could only think about completing ITI and opening my own bridal beauty parlour. She has a unique way of inspiring her students to think about their dreams. Whether it's through active participation in class or watching a video story, her message is always the same: girls, do something for yourselves that will benefit at least two other people.

I chose beauty work because I noticed that people only spend money on two things: food and their beauty. So, I thought I could do well in the beauty industry. People used to tell me that I couldn't do it, but now I feel like I can run a better parlour than them because many salon owners don't have knowledge of the theory behind beauty treatments.

Initially, I was scared to talk to customers and provide them with services, but now I confidently talk to customers, and they often say, "You did a good job, we will definitely come back." Earlier, I used to be afraid and my hands would tremble, but now, with experience, I can manage a parlour well. Currently, I am working in Rohini because I want to gain more experience before opening my own parlour. I believe that having experience in any job is essential before starting something new. But i am also working as a freelancer and earning 7-8k along with my job.

The only problem I faced in this business was with hair work, especially chemical work and different types of cutting. People often say that only boys are good at hair cutting, but I disagree. Girls can also become good hairdressers; they just need practice and a good guide. I am proud to have chosen this business, and I would like to say one more thing before I finish: I have the ability to turn a Nokia phone into an iPhone!"

I started making and selling crochet toys, tops, sweaters, clay jewelry, and whatnot. After 3 years,

Kalaadrishti is still going strong! After getting my diploma, I did a few internships and finally got a job offer for an assistant designer at Diksha Tandon. I worked there for 9 months, where I learned everything I needed to know about a fashion label. Ranging from how to handle production, dealing with labour, markets, clients, designing, etc...

After that, I switched to Label Moni K as an assistant designer/merchandiser where I am currently working. It has been more than 4 months here, and I couldn't be happier. I do sampling and khaka construction—basically, my dream life! It is an absolute pleasure watching your designs become reality in front of you.

And along with being a full time designer, I am a proud business owner, where I get almost 5-6 orders per month. Be it a crochet plushie, a digital portrait, or jewelry,. I have come a long way from knowing nothing, to knowing a lot and still keen on learning everything. Cyber Cafe Success: From ITI to Independence

"My name is Preeti, my father is a tailor, and mother is a home maker. I have a brother or a sister, and everyone's responsibility is that of my parents. I completed my 12th(2018) with this thought. After graduation, I also got a job so that I could support myself financially.

After completing my graduation, I thought i should do something related to my computer. I came to know about ITI and took admission in the COPA trade at Mangolpuri ITI.time, Let me tell you about being an entrepreneur and how we can do our own business.

I had been thinking of starting my own business for a long time, but i had no clue, and even the teachers did not take classes where one could learn about business. But InShakti changed everything. They not only taught me about business but also gave me financial support.





After finishing ITI, I decided that I will open a cyber cafe but investment was required, so I asked my friends and family for the same . I started working in the first month and concentrated on dealing with my customers. In the first month, I made Rs 7 thousand, and i was so happy. I paid my rent and electricity bills, and the next month my earnings were doubled to 14 thousand. I have various competition around me, but my methods are different, The way i deal with customers is commendable, and they also feel very comfortable with me . Now I am earning 20k easily, and i feel so happy about it. I will continue to do the same in the future, all thanks to InShakti."

Designing Dreams: Ananya's Journey to Success

"Hi I am Ananya from ITI Narela. My story begins in Delhi, where I live with my mother and a joint family consisting of my father, uncle, and two sisters in Bakouli village. My father and uncle run a business that involves decorating farmhouses, banquet halls, and other venues for events.

My mother is a homemaker, and we live together as a joint family. When I was born, my parents were working. My father used to work as a truck driver, and my mother was also involved in some work. Since 5th grade, I have been interested in stitching and used to stitch dolls. I used to stitch dresses for them and dress them up.

When I was about to finish my schooling and enter 10th grade, I lost interest in studying. Then the lockdown happened in 2020, and due to the lockdown, all the schools were closed, and there was a break in my studies. During this time, I started helping my sister-in-law with stitching, and I developed a passion for fashion design.





I joined InShakti NGO, where I received training in various skills such as communication, online business, and customer handling. This training inspired me to start my own fashion boutique. I joined a sewing course in Narela, where I learned a lot. The course was excellent, and the teachers were very supportive. Through hard work, I became proficient and confident.



From securing good marks in computer trade, her dreams found her calling in beauty!

"My name is Naina, and I am a COPA trade student. I completed my ITI with good marks in 2023. I joined InShakti because I wanted to do something of my own in life, but I didn't know what to do. I had a lot of questions in my mind, but no answers on how to start or where to start. InShakti gave me a new direction, a new ray of hope, which made me feel that I too can do something of my own. I received support and confidence from them, My interest and my work were the same as what I told InShakti, and I moved forward with them.

There are four members in my family: my mother, father, elder brother, and me. I can't even tell you how much we have struggled in life, but now my mother is working, and she has taken care of us and brought us up so well. My father was not very involved with us, and even now, he is not.

So, we have accepted this truth now because we will be able to do something only by getting out of the problem. My brother also works in Indian Gas Limited. When my brother passed the 12th grade, he wanted to join the army, and he worked very hard for it. But then there was a fight between my mother and father, which had been going on since childhood, but by then, we had grown up and understood everything. At that time, my brother went into depression. It felt like everything had been shattered at that time, but my mother never gave up. She always kept us close to her. Since I passed the 12th grade, I have worked in many places and taken many courses.



After passing the 12th grade, I did an advanced computer course and then worked as a computer operator for 1 year. I was interested in the beauty industry, so after that, I learned the work of a beautician. Just one month after learning, I started working. My salary at that time was 2 thousand rupees because I was a fresher, and it had been only a month since I had learned. I wanted experience, which I got from there. Then my health issues started, and I had to leave work. After the surgery, I started working as a beautician again. I didn't think I would work in this line, but I got a call from where I had worked before. A friend of theirs had opened a new salon, so they hired me as a beautician. I worked there again; it was new for them, and I handled everything. The owner never used to come, so I used to handle everything, and I handled everything for one month, from opening to closing the salon and billing. Then, due to family problems, I had to leave the job. After that, my mother said to do ITI; you will get a good job in computers, but I was thinking,

Why not do an advanced course in beauty? But at my mother's insistence, I took up the COPA trade. That's where I met InShakti, where I discovered myself and chose the same work that I liked to do. I chose to be a beautician, and from there, I felt that I should open my own salon. After completing ITI, InShakti showed me the direction, and I worked on what they showed me. I also did a makeup artist course, which cost me 70,000 rupees. My mother kept her gold earrings in Muthoot Finance to get the money for this course. With the support of InShakti, I started freelancing as a makeup artist, and side by side, I was preparing to open my salon with a loan.

The loan process is still ongoing, and my freelancing is also going on. I am still working because I have not stopped working. Today, my salary is 25,000 rupees at Glam Studio salon, and when my loan is approved, I will have my own salon, where I will not only take salary but also give salary, and I will progress a lot. Challenges and Earnings: I am trying my luck and my destiny right now because the loan process is going on. I am earning as much as I can, and I am patient because patience pays off."

From a Clueless Student to Thriving Handicraft Entrepreneur



In my family, there is my father, mother, 2 older brothers, and one sister-in-law. My mother and sister-in-law are housewives. My father is a paralyzed patient and handicapped. My brother works at LIC.

I come from a middle-class family, and since childhood, I had a dream of becoming a fashion designer. After completing 12th grade, I learned basic stitching from a government NGO. It was a 6-month course, and I learned it for free. I also learned free stitching to improve my skills. I won two fashion shows challenges.

When I learned stitching, I didn't know how to work, what the market demands, or how to talk to customers. Stitching clothes according to customer preferences was difficult because I had no idea how to discuss with them or how to price my work.

InShakti helped me with my startup. They helped me with funding, and my business started. I started cutting and tailoring. I named my business "Avtar Look" so that people would know about our work. I made business cards and learned to take pictures of my products. This helped people understand my work better. To attract more customers, I gave surprise gifts and provided good service. After the digital class, I received a lot of help. I learned to talk to people to grow my business.

Customers started liking my work and extra services. So, I changed my rates. Earlier, I used to charge very little, but now I charge according to my work. After changing the rates, my monthly income increased from 6000 to 8000.

With the help of InShakti, I learned how to grow my business, how to make customers, and how to work from low rates to high rates. Now, I plan to buy a sewing machine, an overlock machine, and keep a tailor. I will also start working on ready-made clothes. I will buy fabric from the market for my sewing work. For all this, I will take a loan from the bank.


